April Speaker Focus

Tracy Rouleau will be speaking about the Stormwater Partners Network, a local coalition that advocates for clean water, protecting and improving our watersheds in ways that are equitable and ecologically sensitive, improving community resilience to stormwater impacts such as storm-driven flooding, and connecting communities to their backyard waterways.



Tracy and her family have lived in Gaithersburg for 18 years. She has been a member of the Stormwater Partners Network since 2017, and has served on the Executive Steering Committee since 2018. She also served on the Muddy Branch Alliance from 2014-2020 (President, 2017-2020), working to expand opportunities for students and residents to volunteer and engage in outdoor activities and care of the Muddy Branch Park. She has served on the Montgomery County Water Quality Advisory Group since 2016, as Chair since 2017. Professionally, she is the President and founder of TBD Economics, LLC, an environmental economics consulting firm, and recently took a position as the Director of Conservation Planning and Evaluation at the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF).

Chapter letter to Governor Moore

Our Chapter sent a letter to Governor Wes Moore on February 27, 2025 requesting a change in the designated use class for a large section of the North Branch of the Potomac River from Bloomington, MD to Pinto, MD. The quality of trout fishing here has rebounded since the closure of an industrial facility that used to discharge warm water into the river. The letter supports efforts to establish a cold-water refuge for the continued survival of native brook trout which rely on cold water to survive and reproduce. Elevated water temperatures reduce oxygen levels and increase cortisol— a stress hormone—in trout, which in turn impairs growth, diminishes feeding, and weakens immune function.

The change would not interfere with another industry using the land of the now closed Piedmont Pulp and Paper Company in Luke, MD. However, it would require that any future water discharge be managed to not raise river temperatures to a level that would harm fish. The new designated use class would help prevent the return of harmful, warm, point-source industrial discharges and safeguard the health and sustainability of local trout populations.

IWLA Rockville Outdoor Shooting Leagues

April starts the beginning of the outdoor shooting activities at the IWLA Rockville Chapter and are open to the public.

The Pistol League starts Tuesday, April 8th, and runs weekly through the end of Sept. Come as often or as little as you like. It is a 30-shot match at 25yds (10 slow fire, 10 timed fire, 10 rapid fire). The fee is \$30 for Rimfire or Centerfire and \$40 for both, for the whole season. Chapter .22 pistols are available for use, just bring .22 LR standard velocity ammo. Ear and eye protection is required. It is a handicap league, so improvement is rewarded.

The Muzzleloader League starts on Wednesday, April 2nd, and runs monthly on the first Wednesday of each month through October. The match is 10 rounds in 40 minutes. The fee is \$2 per relay.

The Rifle League starts on Wednesday, April 9th, and runs monthly on the second Wednesday of each month through October. It is a 30 shot match, distance is 25 or 50 yds. Only rifles which shoot a pistol cartridge are allowed (.22, 9mm, M1 Carbine, etc./no bottleneck cartridges). The fee is \$2 per relay. A Chapter .22 bolt action rifle is available for use, just bring .22 LR standard velocity ammo.

The First IWLAR Stop the Bleed Class was held for 10 students on Sunday, Feb 23 at the Upper Chapter House.
