Volunteers Needed for 3-D Archery

Volunteers are needed to act as Marshalls for the 3-D archery shoots. No experience is required. The minimum requirement is to be able to sit in one area for the duration of a 3-D archery shoot! This is an easy way to earn up to your 6 hours in one day.

Dates: June 8, 22, July 6, 20, August 3, 17, 31

Tasks:

- Working as a team of 3.
- Arrive around 7am.
- Block part off the parking so shooters will have a place to park.
- Set up the sign in/out table near the 3-D archery shed by 7:45 am.
- OPTIONAL set up the pop-up tent for shade.
- Collect \$5 from member participants, and \$10 from non-member participants. Participants under the age of 18 are free.
- Remind participants that they need to check out with you before noon.
- Put the table, chairs and the popup tent away.
- Pass the money collected and the event report to the Team Leader who will turn it in to the Treasurer.
- Experienced Marshalls may be asked to walk the course in advance and be ready to deal with fallen branches, etc. and verify that the Trails Closed signs are in place
- Experienced Marshalls may be asked to patrol the course and keep an eye on the shooters and check the targets.
- Make sure lights in Chapter House are off and all doors are locked (unless another group is meeting there).
- Report any issues or problems to the Team Leader who will report them to the 2nd Vice President.

Call or email Bill Jackson about which Sunday morning(s) you want to sign up for. Three volunteers are needed for each shoot, and you may volunteer for multiple Sundays.

"In Lieu of Work Hours" Payment to Increase

The new, updated Chapter Bylaws were approved at the General Membership Meeting on April 4th. As part of the changes to the Bylaws, the amount charged in lieu of the annual requirement for six volunteer work hours was increased from \$75 to \$150. The increase will take effect at the membership renewal process beginning this September for calendar year 2026.

Range Officers Please Note: In order to plan and schedule RO assignments without interruption, ROs are required to renew and have their work hours completed by October 31st or run the risk of incurring the \$150 fee.

Highlights of March 21, Board of Directors Meeting

- A physical security committee has been established to help define who will have access to the security camera system and who will maintain the locks, keycodes, and keys for the Chapter.
