July Speaker Focus

Paul Kreingold is a thirty-seven-year resident of Leesburg, Virginia, where he and his wife have raised two children. He is currently the president of the Banshee Reeks Chapter of the Virginia Master Naturalists, and the conservation director of the Izaak Walton League, Loudoun County Chapter.



His interest in geology and history dates back to his college days, but after a long career in computer system design, he has devoted his time in the last five years as a researcher and educator.

Besides public lectures throughout Loudoun, Montgomery and Frederick Counties, Kreingold regularly leads "expeditions" to the rediscovered Latrobe Potomac Marble quarry along the beautiful Potomac River.

Paul will discuss some of the two-hundred year-old quarries, and has polished samples from these local quarries for display. He will also discuss some historical facts related to the War of 1812, such as:

1. The step-by-step invasion of the British from the Patuxent River to D.C.

2. The methods the British used to actually burn the stone buildings; after all, how do you burn stone?

3. How stone was quarried in the early 19th century, along with sample quarry tools.

4. The utilization of George Washington's Potomac Canal to ship the stone to D.C. for carving.

Range Rules Changes

The chapter Range Safety Committee applied revisions to the Chapter Range Rules that were recently approved by the Board of Directors. The most significant changes range users need to be aware of are:

• Firearms must be carried in a closed or latched container to ensure they are not readily accessible or visible when transported (the firearm must be in a case that completely encloses it or inside an enclosed range bag or similar container).

 \cdot Smoking is not allowed in the pistol range house at any time.

• Chapter sanctioned event sponsors may authorize individuals to park in the pistol range area during those events without range coordinator or Board of Directors approval.

 \cdot Airbows (a newer archery platform) was added to the archery range rules, which have been permitted on the archery range.

All straight-walled cartridges may be used on the pistol range (including straight walled rifle cartridges). All bottleneck cartridges (handgun and rifle) must be checked for size conformance in the pistol range cartridge gauge before use on the pistol range. Low powered rifle and handgun bottleneck cartridges (e.g., 44-40 Winchester, 357 SIG, etc.) were checked and they fit in the gauge, so they may be used on the pistol range.
Range Officers must renew their membership by October 31 each year and maintain a current email address with the Chapter at all times.

These changes will enhance everyone's enjoyment and improve management of our ranges. The new range rules can be found on the Chapter website.
