CPR Classes To Be Offered

Our Chapter's first Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) certification classes since pre-COVID are being offered on Sunday, August 21 and August 28 in the Upper Chapter House from 1 PM to 5 PM. If you or someone you know needs CPR certification (or recertification) from the American Heart Association, which is is valid for 2 years, this is the training opportunity.

- Class Goals
- Describe the importance of high-quality CPR and its impact on survival.
- Describe all of the steps of the Chain of Survival and apply the Basic Life Support (BLS) concepts of the Chain of Survival.
- Recognize the signs of someone needing CPR.
- Perform high-quality CPR on adults, children, and infants.
- Describe the importance of early AED use and demonstrate using one.
- Provide effective ventilations with a barrier device.
- Describe the importance of teams in multi-rescuer resuscitation and perform as an effective team member during multi-rescuer CPR.
- Describe the technique for relief of foreign-body airway obstruction (choking) for adults and infants.
- Chapter member and qualified CPR instructor, Sheila Colihan, is offering the class for \$40 (comparable fee is \$85 to \$100) to cover materials. Class size is limited to 16 students.

Books will be provided for student use during class only, but if you would like a book to keep at home as a reference once you've learned the skills of CPR, you are encouraged to purchase (\$12) your own copy of "Basic Life Support (BLS) Provider Manual" by the American Heart Association which can be found online at Amazon.com and other online retailers.

Because our Chapter views this training as a public service to the community, participation from non-Chapter members who also need CPR certification (or recertification) at the Chapter member price are welcome.

This is training that can save lives, so please spread the word. To reserve a seat in the class, contact Rich Clement for additional information, provide the class date (August 21 or 28), and to receive an electronic payment link. Additional class dates in September may be offered based on interest.

Join the Fishing 101 Class on September 10, 2022!

The Seneca Valley Trout Unlimited (SVTU) and the Izaak Walton League of America, Rockville (IWLA-R) chapters are joining together to offer both teens and adults an introduction to fishing and fly fishing. This class is the perfect opportunity for someone interested in learning the basics needed to get up and running and out on the water.

The class is free of charge for participants and will take place on September 10, 2022 from 10am - 4pm at the IWLA-R Jim Berrier Memorial Lake at 12057 Clopper Road, Germantown, MD 20874. It will include four hours of instruction, with combination of demonstrations, hands-on practice, and an opportunity to put the skills you have learned in the class at the end of the day. Class topics will include:

- A general overview of fishing and fly fishing
- Where to fish locally, and how to find places to fish
- Fishing Ethics
- Knots and rigging
- What fish eat (flies and lures)
- Casting and techniques

SVTU and IWLA-R will provide all the necessary equipment for the class. To ensure that we have enough equipment and handouts, the class is limited to 25 participants.
