

President's Message

It has been a HOT summer and very dry! If you are hiking be careful of the heat. If you are fishing on the lake, release the fish as quickly as possible to avoid mortalities in the warm water (it has less oxygen). Maryland Department of Natural Resources (DNR) has issued an advisory for cold/cool water fishing recommending very careful handling of trout, even in the catch and release areas

If you are going to go to fish in cold/cool water, make sure to take a thermometer with you to check the stream temperature. DNR recommends avoiding trout when water temperatures exceed 68 degrees Fahrenheit. Catching trout at these temperatures can be lethal. At temperatures between 65 and 67 degrees, minimize handling, and keep the fish in the water as much as possible due to heat stress on trout.

I just returned from the IWLA National Convention in Cambridge Maryland held July 14-17. (Talk about someplace HOT!) It was my first IWLA National Convention and it was both informative and fun. The Hyatt Regency Chesapeake Bay Golf Resort, Spa, and Marina is a really nice facility. IWLA elected national officers, voted on policy resolutions, and announced the location of next summer's convention (Green Bay, Wisconsin).

We sought member input on the two resolutions. Our Rockville membership was supportive of both the resolution to require best dredging practices and the phasing out of gasoline powered lawn and garden equipment (except chain saws). The delegates at the convention voted to accept the best dredging practices and reject the phase out of gas-powered lawn and garden equipment. The back story on the best dredging practices comes from the Upper Mississippi Basin where the dredging activities are filling back channels and covering mussel beds damaging the river ecosystem.

There are plenty of activities ongoing this summer. Check the calendar for the full list. As a reminder the calendar is in the top menu (above the logo) on the website https://iwlar.org/. Check out the many options.

And it is not too late to think about volunteering at the Montgomery County Fair (August 9-17). We always need staffing for our Izaak Walton booth. Drones Galore!

On noon Saturday, we had our first joint drone flying event with the DC Area Drone Users Group. It was well received and we hope to schedule another one soon. We had about 15 participants and three participants from our chapter (AJ Murch, David Whiteis, and myself). The location was a Montgomery County Park in Boyds, MD, created for skateboarders. The field was large with only a few trees and some power lines that flyers had to watch. Two pilots were flying the new DJI Avata first person view (FPV) drones. The pilot of those drones wear highdefinition 3-D goggles linked to the high-definition camera on the drone. This gives the pilot the illusion that they are on-board the drone as it flies around obstacles. This is quite an experience. The manufacturer recommends that you remain seated when flying these.

The drone pilot uses a hand motion controller to control the flight. These are fairly intuitive to use and requires very little training. Rotating the wrist to the right or left will result in a turn, tilting up or done results in a climb or descent, and pressing a button on the control can automatically land the drone. Updates from the May-July BOD meetings

 Formation of a 2024 Bylaws Review committee with Cindy Stevens, Derrick Tabor and Jim Seach. This was done because it is time, and because National requires a periodic review.

BOD Updates Continued

- The May 3, Support is Sprouting auction resulted in almost \$1,600 for Chapter activities.
- There is a 3D archery fee of \$5 for non-members (free for members).
- The summer Archery Program has been operating under the same leadership for several years, but the current leader is moving on to other activities, we have a critical need for Summer Archery program leaders.
- IWLAR provided each registered attendee of the IWLA National Convention with a free, refillable water bottle, to both advertise our work and to reduce plastic waste. We used \$350 from the Convention budget for this purpose.
- The Range Safety Committee was asked to develop information about the use of our ranges for NRA Firearms Training Courses to help the Board understand the need for waivers to the range rules to conduct specific elements of certain classes.
- In an attempt to increase the volunteer hours, the board approved an increase in the cost of not completing the six hours of volunteer time. The annual contribution in lieu of volunteer time will go from \$75 to \$150 effective 2026. This Board approved change will go to the Bylaws Review Committee and be combined with other possible Bylaw changes to come before the General Membership in the fall.
- The BoD approved Zane Marrone's eagle scout proposal to install a First Aid station in the Lake Pavillion. The approval was for the concept only.

BOD Updates Continued

- The Board also approved an addition to the Bylaws clarifying that members may not give their access card to a non-member, not even a family member, without possible consequences including loss of access privileges. This Board approved action will also come before the General Membership in the fall.
- Established a temporary committee to determine location, policies for use and oversight for the gas fire pit table behind the CH. There is a game night planned every second Friday Sep-June (Joyce).
- Rockville is hosting the MD Division Meeting on October 5.
- Some of the extra water bottles with the Rockville logo that we passed out at the National Convention will to go to Fair volunteers.
- AED has new batteries and pads (and I hope we never need to use it), thanks to Eric Tehrani for making sure it is up to date.
- Vice President Tom Vegella will preside at the August 5 meeting
