Upcoming Hunter Education Course

The Montgomery County Seneca Creek State Park Maryland Department of Natural Resources Hunter Education Instructor Team is offering Hunter Education online courses with three field day workshops on September 8, October 5, and November 15, at IWLAR. The in-person field day workshops are conducted by certified Hunter Education Instructors to evaluate the student's understanding of the material learned during the online course, and include a pass/fail "trail walk" and live-fire safe firearms handling conducted under the direct supervision of Range Safety Officers on a certified shooting range. If you have students interested in Jr. BB gun (ages 8-15) or Jr. Air Rifle (ages 12-18), please contact Susan Cassell if you are interested. The classes are limited to 8 students, with priority given to returning students, Chapter members, and then the public. There are only 2 spaces left in each class.

Lake Construction Project

After a long process to develop a plan and acquire the permits, construction will be starting on the lake inflow project the week of August 26. It is expected to take about four weeks (hopefully they will be finished before Hunting and Fishing Day). This project is a major construction effort with heavy excavators, trucks and other equipment. This will mean several changes to usual lake activities.

There will be stakes and flags placed in many locations – LEAVE THEM ALONE. If they are removed, we will have to hire the engineering firm to come back and restake. That could extend construction by days and cost \$1,000 or more.

The north end of the lake will be closed to all members and all traffic. (That is the far end of the lake as you drive in). So, if you wish to go to the pavilion, you will have to take the left fork in the road at the sign. The pier will be accessible from the right fork. You must exit the same way you enter.

Since the construction will be primarily using the right fork by the pier, if you do park there, please make sure you are well off the main road. (Walking to the pier from the pavilion might avoid a truck, please consider using your feet.)

On some days, when major excavation is ongoing, we may need to close the lake to allow full access by the construction crews. We do not know if, or when, closures may be needed. Notice will be sent via the Google Group and posted on the website.

We will place a notice on the front page of the website about construction activities and send notices via the Google Group. Please check the website or your google notices before planning an outing at the lake.

Finally, please be patient. We will have some short-term interruption, but it will be worth it.

Rockville Ikes Compete in 2024 National Matches

Rich Clement from Maryland and Tom Willats from North Carolina (NC) reunited on the firing line to compete in the GLOCK Sport Shooting Federation (GSSF) Camp Perry National Challenge, part of the Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) National Matches.

The GSSF CMP National Challenge included four different pistol categories: Stock, Unlimited, Rimfire and MOS (Modular Optic System) and saw over 200 match entries. Rich placed 6th and Tom placed 8th Overall High Senior in the Stock Glock Division with a course of fire of 50 rounds timed-fire at five targets from 5 yards to 25 yards using open sights. Rich also placed 17th Overall in the Unlimited Glock and 24th Overall in the MOS Glock Divisions.

Although it was Rich's first time competing at Camp Perry, Tom has been competing at Camp Perry for 25 years, winning the 2013 Citizen's Military Pistol Trophy as the highest scoring civilian in the National Trophy Individual match.



Rich and Tom volunteered together as NRA Certified Pistol Instructors on the IWLAR NRA Training Team from 2013 to 2019, when Tom moved to NC. Good shooting Rich and Tom!
